

Remindo – Verifying/Approving/Giving permission

In order to guarantee exam security when performing e-assessment, certain criteria should be met. The exam should be conducted on a Chromebook on a secured network and the teacher has to verify the exam at the start.

Verification is important because of the following reasons:

- **Verification allows the teacher to check whether all students start simultaneously with the exam.**
- **Verification allows the teacher to check whether all students are logged in on the correct computer**
Making sure that student X doesn't login for student Y on laptop Z.
- **Verification prevents students from logging in for a different student unnoticed, disallowing them from answering each other's questions.**
During a calamity/reboot of the Chromebook – if verification occurs for that exam – the student must ask permission (again) to start with the (digital) exam. In such as case, it is logical for students to again ask for permission and for teachers to give them permission in order for the student to continue working on their exam.

However, it is also possible for a student who has already finished his exam to login using another student's login credentials to finish their exam. In such a case, the laptop has to be rebooted and the teacher has to verify again, which is suspicious (as there are no laptop problems).

Students could then also login for each other during the exam and therefore help each other by answering each other's exam questions. They could be rebooting laptops as if they were exchanging notes. If you never verify as a teacher, you cannot check on this. If you do, it won't go unnoticed.

PLEASE NOTE! *If a student again asks for permission to start the exam, check whether the correct student is sitting in front of the correct laptop.*
